

Day Vending in Zapata County: What you need to know.

Facts about the Zapata County Day Vending Ordinance

What is a day vendor?

A day vendor is a person who sells merchandise, food, beverages, and/or services in a temporary, transient or mobile business from a vehicle, trailer, or temporary shelter.

What is a Peddler?

A peddler is a person who moves from place to place selling goods, merchandise, fruits or vegetables that are whole and uncut. A peddler may sell from a wagon, pushcart, handcart, pack, or basket.

Requirements to obtain a Day Vendor License:

- ✓ \$300.00 license fee for one year or \$25.00 per month.
- ✓ \$25.00 application processing fee (to be credited to the license fee).
- ✓ Identification such as a driver's license or other official photo identification.
- ✓ Indicate the type of items to be sold.
- ✓ Vendors must be at least 18 years of age.
- ✓ Any outstanding County debt, such as speeding tickets, water bills, or property taxes must be paid.
- ✓ A written statement indicating that no money is owed to the County. This can be obtained from County Tax Assessor/Collector located inside the Courthouse at 200 E. 7th Ave. Ste. 226, Zapata, TX. 78076. (956) 765-9971.

Vending Rules:

- ✓ Vendor license must be visible and/or accessible at all times while vending.
- ✓ Vending is allowed only in the Zapata County Vending District.

How do I Apply?

Day vendors should apply in person at the Zapata County Code Enforcement Office located at 605 N. Hwy 83 Ste. B, Zapata, TX. 78076. Hours are Monday-Friday 8:00 am – 5:00 pm. You may also download the application at www.co.zapata.tx.us. An appointment is recommended and can be made by calling (956) 765-8618.

Where Can I Sell?

The Zapata County Fairgrounds has been designated by the Zapata County Commissioners Court as a "Vending District" known as the "The Zapata County Fairgrounds Farmers and Ranchers Market". All day vendors are allowed to sell their merchandise at this location only.
